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Independent Assurance Report

Our independence and quality management

We have complied with the independence and other ethical requirements of the Code of Professional Conduct for Registered Auditors issued by the Independent Regulatory Board for Auditors (IRBA Code), which is founded on fundamental principles of integrity, objectivity, professional competence and due care, confidentiality and professional behavior. The IRBA Code is consistent with the corresponding sections of the International Ethics Standards Board for Accountants' International Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (including International Independence Standards).

Practitioner's responsibilities

This standard requires that we plan and perform our procedures to obtain reasonable assurance about whether, in all material respects, management's assertion is fairly stated, and, accordingly, included:

- 1. obtaining an understanding of TrustFactory-CA's key and certificate lifecycle management business practices and its controls over key and certificate integrity, over the authenticity and confidentiality of subscriber and relying party information, over the continuity of key and certificate lifecycle management operations and over development, maintenance and operation of systems integrity;
- 2. selectively testing transactions executed in accordance with disclosed key and certificate lifecycle management business practices;
- 3. testing and evaluating the operating effectiveness of the controls; and
- 4. performing such other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

We believe that the evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Relative effectiveness of controls

The relative effectiveness and significance of specific controls at TrustFactory-CA and their effect on assessments of control risk for subscribers and relying parties are dependent on their interaction with the controls, and other factors present at individual subscriber and relying party



locations. We have performed no procedures to evaluate the effectiveness of controls at individual subscriber and relying party locations.

Inherent limitations

There are inherent limitations in the effectiveness of any system of internal control, including the possibility of human error and the circumvention of controls. For example, because of their nature, controls may not prevent, or detect unauthorized access to systems and information, or failure to comply with internal and external policies or requirements. Also, the projection to the future of any conclusions based on our findings is subject to the risk that controls may become ineffective.

Opinion

In our opinion, throughout the period 08 October 2024 to 07 October 2025, TrustFactory-CA Management's Assertion, as referred to above, is fairly stated, in all material respects, in accordance with the WebTrust Principles and Criteria for Certification Authorities, v2.2.2 and those provisions contained within Chapter 3 of the Accreditation Regulations of the Electronic Communications and Transaction Act of 2002 and ISO/SANS 21188.

This report does not include any representation as to the quality of TrustFactory-CA's services beyond those covered by the WebTrust Principles and Criteria for Certification Authorities, v2.2.2 and those provisions contained within Chapter 3 of the Accreditation Regulations of the Electronic Communications and Transaction Act of 2002 and ISO/SANS 21188, nor the suitability of any of TrustFactory-CA's services for any customer's intended purpose.
